

Lieutenant General Ron Christmas USMC (Retired) Past President and CEO Marine Corps Heritage Foundation

Lieutenant General Christmas is currently an Advisor to the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation and served as the President and CEO from 1997 until his retirement on September 15, 2011. During this period, he successfully led the effort to construct the National Museum of the Marine Corps and Heritage Center.

He was commissioned into the Marine Corps through the NROTC program at the University of Pennsylvania in 1962. He served in various infantry command and staff assignments as a company grade officer including command of Company H, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines in Vietnam. He was seriously wounded during the battle for Hue City in the Tet Offensive of 1968 and for his actions he was awarded the Navy Cross and Purple Heart Medal. Some of his key assignments include Commanding Officer (CO), Marine Barracks, Annapolis, MD; CO, 1st Recruit Training Battalion, Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island; CO, 3rd Marines; Commanding General (CG), 9th Marine Expeditionary Brigade; CG, 3rd Force Service Support Group; CG, I Marine Expeditionary Force; and the Director for Operations, US Pacific Command. He retired from the Marine Corps in 1996 after 34 years active duty. His final assignment was Deputy Commandant for Manpower and Reserve Affairs.

From September 1996 until December 2006, as well as being President of the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation, he served as a Senior Mentor, Marine Air-Ground Task Force Staff Training Program, and the Joint Forces Command. Other projects during this period included Member, Congressional Commission on Military Training and Gender-Related Issues; Adjunct Staff, RAND Corporation; Consultant, Harris Corporation; Member, Board of Advisors, Recruit Military, LLC; Member, Expert Advisory Panel, Workforce Planning and Analysis, Wexford Group; Adjunct Faculty, Joint Forces Staff College; Ex-Officio Trustee, Marine Corps University Foundation; Ex-Officio Governor, Marine Corps Association; and Director, Stone Energy Corporation.

With the growth of the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation's mission and enterprises, General Christmas became the full time President and CEO until his retirement in September 2011. He now devotes his time to advising the Foundation, lecturing on the Vietnam War and urban warfare, and public speaking. He served Stafford County, Virginia as the volunteer Chairman of the Community Fund Raising Team supporting the 350th Anniversary Celebration in 2014, and currently serves as a member of the Stafford County Armed Services Memorial Commission, and as a Trustee of the Stafford Hospital Foundation. Other activities include serving as the Chief Archer of the Order of Saint Crispin and the President, Center House Association which supports programs of the Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C. He also serves as a member of the Department of Defense Advisory Group for the Commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War.

Lieutenant General Christmas is married to the former Sherry Lownds. They have 4 children and 13 grandchildren.



Major General James W. Lukeman, USMC (Retired) President & Chief Executive Officer of the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation

Major General James W. Lukeman retired from active duty on July 1, 2020, after 40 years of continuous active service. He was born in Beaufort, South Carolina and was raised in a Marine Corps family. He graduated from the University of Notre Dame with a Bachelor of Science in Chemical Engineering and was commissioned through the NROTC program in 1980.

Major General Lukeman's assignments in the operating forces included Rifle and Weapons Platoon Commander in Alpha Company and 81mm Mortar Platoon Commander, 1st Battalion, 2nd Marines; Assistant Operations Officer and Company Commander of Lima Company, 3rd Battalion, 6th Marines; Executive Officer of 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines; and Operations Officer, 1st Marine Division. He commanded 2nd Battalion,

5th Marines and served as the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-7 and G-3 for the 1st Marine Division in Iraq during Operation IRAQI FREEDOM.

Other assignments include Director of Career Course at the Staff NCO academy at Quantico, Virginia; Operations Officer, Alpha Company, Marine Security Guard Battalion in Frankfurt, Germany; Marine Officer Instructor at NROTC Unit at the University of Texas at Austin; Assistant for Strategy and Force Planning in the Battalion and Chief of Staff for Training and Education Command; and Military Assistant to the Assistant Commandant.

As a General Officer, he served as Deputy Director for Strategy and Plans, J5, US Africa Command; Commanding General of the Second Marine Division; Commanding General, Training and Education Command; Assistant Chief of Staff, U/C/J-5, United Nations Command/Combined Forces Command/U.S. Forces and Commanding General, U.S. Marine Corps Forces Korea; and Inspector General of the Marine Corps.

Major General Lukeman is a graduate of the Marine Corps Amphibious Warfare School, Marine Corps Command and Staff College, and the National War College.

Lima One - Fort Page

Bing served as a grunt in CAP Lima-One in Chulai in '66-'67. His book, The Village, about Lima-One was on the Commandant's Reading List for fifty years. He also served as Assistant Secretary of Defense and deployed dozens of times to Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan. He has written a dozen bestselling books about those three wars.

A member of Council on Foreign Relations and the Infantry Order of St. Crispin, his awards include the Department of Defense Distinguished Service Medal (twice), the Marine Corps Heritage Award (three times), Tunisia's Medaille de Liberte and the Marine Corps Russell Award for Leadership.



Dr. Jeannie L. Johnson, Founding Director Center for Anticipatory Intelligence Utah State University

Jeannie L. Johnson is the Director of the Center for Anticipatory Intelligence (CAI) on USU's campus and a Professor in the Political Science department. CAI has launched the nation's first academic degrees in Anticipatory Intelligence and specializes in using interdisciplinary problem-solving teams to tackle the globe's complex security concerns.

Dr. Johnson worked within the Central Intelligence Agency's Directorate of Intelligence as a member of the Balkan Task Force from 1998-1999 and served with the US State Department in Embassies Paris and Zagreb. The Cultural Topography analytic method she pioneered with co-author Matt Berrett was featured in CIA's June 2011 edition of Studies in Intelligence.

Dr. Johnson's primary research interest, strategic culture, examines the impact of national and organizational cultures on the formation of security policy. Dr. Johnson has applied strategic culture analysis to the nuclear issue and has co-edited two books on that topic. She has also conducted in-depth research on US national and military service cultures, including critical blind spots in US foreign and security policy.

Her book, "The Marines, Counterinsurgency, and Strategic Culture: Lessons Learned and Lost in America's Wars" highlights the experience of the Vietnam-era CAP Marines and includes a foreword from former USMC General Jim Mattis. She served on US Defense Secretary Mattis's Close Combat Lethality Task Force as a subject matter expert and continues to work with the

intelligence community and military services on advancing the strategic impact of cultural analysis.

Dr. Johnson received her doctorate in strategic studies from the University of Reading in 2013.



David Britton, Vocalist

Songwriter and world class baritone, David Britton's musical and personal backgrounds are as unique as they come, and it's that eclectic combination of influences and experiences that have shaped the unmistakable and powerful sound he is known for today. David's style blends complex rock orchestration with big vocals, often backed by a gospel choir.

Raised abroad by missionary parents, David first developed his passion for music and diverse cultural styles while traveling with them around the world, learning Dutch, Italian, French, and German along the way. David eventually discovered his love for opera while studying voice at Westmont College where he was also a drummer in a rock band, and continued refining his vocal skills post grad, earning his Master's in Vocal Performance at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. With over twenty roles in his catalogue, David has sung at opera houses and concert halls around the world, including Carnegie Hall in the world premiere of The Dawn of Japan with the Orchestra of St. Luke's.

Now residing with his family in Phoenix, AZ, David has released four albums, most recently, The Storm, a reflection on the human condition and an expression of the daily physical, mental, emotional or spiritual battles we face. "The Storm" was created as an attempt to embrace that very real struggles exist in the world while also acknowledging that despite that pain, there can be moments of real peace and tranquility.



Kristopher Battles Resident Combat Artist National Museum of the Marine Corps

Kristopher Battles is a contemporary fine artist creating artworks in a variety of media which honor the highest traditions of representational art.

Battles graduated with a BFA in Painting from Northeast Missouri State University (now Truman State University) in December 1991, and earned his MFA in Illustration from the University of Hartford in September 2013.

Originally serving as a Marine Reservist from 1986-1996, Battles became a Marine combat artist after reenlisting in 2006, and deployed to Overseas Contingency Operations several times to create art for the United States Marine Corps, serving in that billet until 2014. From 2014-2019, Battles served as a civilian combat artist for the Naval History and Heritage Command at the Navy Yard in Washington, DC. Battles is currently the Marine Corps Artist in Residence, on staff at the National Museum of the Marine Corps in Quantico, VA.

His work has been featured in publications and art venues across the country, including the Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum in Washington, D.C. as a part of the art show "Fly Marines! The Centennial of Marine Corps Aviation 1912-2012" from January 2012 through January 2013.

Battles' work was featured on the cover of Leatherneck magazine, March 2008, December 2009, and August 2020. His illustrations for the "Sharing the Courage" series were featured in Marines magazine, Oct/Nov/Dec 2009, and in a Marine Corps Times article "Heroics illustrated, comic-book style" by James K Sanborn, March 22, 2010.

Battles was featured in the New York Times Arts & Leisure section on July 18, 2010, in an article by Carol Kino entitled, "With Sketchpads and Guns, Semper Fi".

Battles has been invited to be a guest speaker and artist for many events and organizations. He was featured at USS Constitution Museum, Boston, MA during Marine Week in May, 2010, and his work was also on display May 5, 2010 in the John F. Kennedy School of Government for Harvard University. Battles was also guest speaker at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, January 28, 2011, and was forum speaker at The Army and The Navy Club in Washington, DC March 2, 2011.

Battles was featured in ABC's "Persons of the Week: Combat Artists" with Charlie Gibson, September 2007, along with fellow combat artist and Hartford MFA alumnus Michael Fay, and combat artists Charles Grow and Col Charles Waterhouse.

Battles is a 2008 and 2010 recipient of the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation's John W. Thomason Award for excellence in combat art. and the 2010 and 2011 recipient of the Marine Corps Combat Correspondence Association's Merit Award for Combat Art.

Monument Symbolism and Design Features

Lining both sides of Pavilion Trail, engraved bricks memorialize the names of over 540 CAP Marines and Navy Corpsmen who made the ultimate sacrifice.

The CAP Monument is surrounded by bricks with the names of CAP Marines and Navy Corpsmen who donated the funds for this monument. As in Vietnam, the success of the Combined Action Program depended upon the commitment of young, enlisted CAP Marines and Corpsmen. Likewise, the construction of the CAP Monument depended upon the commitment of those same CAP Marines and Navy Corpsmen who built it 'one brick at a time.'

The black granite represents a squad of ten to fourteen Marines and a Navy Corpsman embedded within a South Vietnamese village. The gray granite represents the Vietnamese Popular Force troops. These two military units complemented each other's strengths, producing a formidable CAP Combat Platoon.


The keystone, with both CAP emblems proudly displayed on front and back, symbolizes the importance of this unit during the Vietnam war. The Combined Action Program was a key element of the Marine Corps counter-insurgency policy in Vietnam. The black granite border of the Keystone forms the letter "V," representing Vietnam.

The monument's etched scenes depict the three strategies common to every Combined Action Platoon from 1965-1971:

- -The **Night Ambush Patrol** etched into the front of the monument, portrays the heavy responsibility of the point man and those who cautiously followed him to protect the villagers from invasion.
- -The **Day Patrol** on the upper back side of the monument demonstrates CAP Marines patrolling openly through the village hamlets, providing security, identifying future patrol and ambush sites, and interacting with the local people to forge good relationships and gain valuable intelligence.

-The Corpsman Treating Villagers, or MEDCAP on the lower back section of the monument shows a CAP Navy Corpsman conducting a medical clinic under the watchful eyes of CAP Marines. The CAP Corpsman was the 'Village Doc', winning hearts and minds of the villagers.

The CAP Monument is a living testament to the grit of the young men who served in the villages, and the Marine Corps ethos that encouraged their freedom to adapt to the conditions on the field of battle.






Combined Action Platoon "Night Ambush Patrol"

A Tribute to Edwin Falloon 4/21/45-9/27/65



Account of Edwin Falloon by hospital corpsman.

My name is Jeffrey Erwin. I was the hospital corpsman attached to the Combined Action Platoon in the village of Phu Bai in September, 1965. The platoon went out on a combined action night patrol on Sept. 27th and headed west along the river that ran through Phu Bai. At about a mile out we entered a very dark path that ran under overhanging trees.

All of a sudden automatic rifle fire erupted. Our point marine had opened up with his M-14 on a Viet Cong patrol that was on the same path, but moving in the opposite direction. His brave action saved us by taking out the lead elements of the VC patrol. However, he had made himself a target with the muzzle flashes of his M-14, and was killed by the remaining elements of the VC patrol. We only took two walking wounded: one was wounded in his foot, and the other was myself taking a graze on my left arm. Sgt McCarthy was our CAP commander.

Eventually, our patrol made its way back to the Popular Forces camp in the village of Phu Bai where our two wounded were evacuated by truck to the field hospital at the Phu Bai Marine base. Now I know the name of that brave and steadfast marine who gave his life to save our patrol from more serious casualties. Semper Fi!

LCPL Falloon certainly deserves this remembrance.
